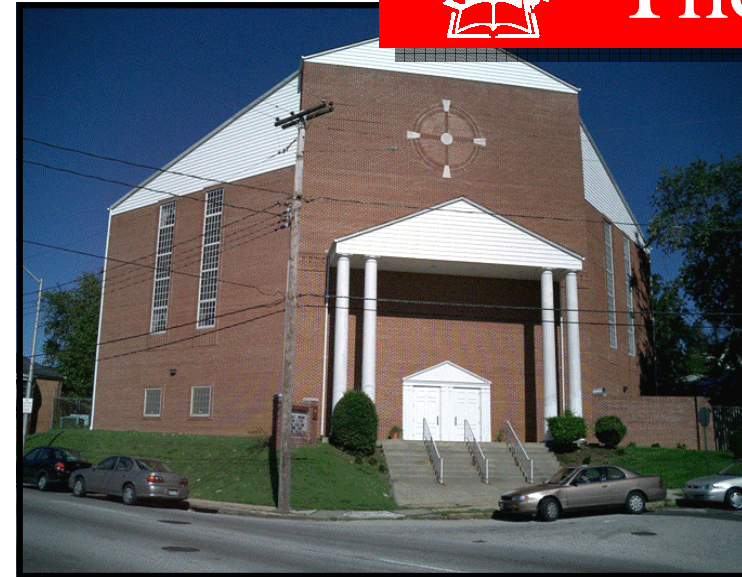

From the Minister

Honoring Fathers

The roles and the responsibilities of fathers are important and necessary. Fathers are providers and protectors. They promote and nurture learning and they punish wrongdoings and reprimand infractions when necessary. Fathers are to be respected. As the scripture commands in Exodus 20:12, we are commanded to honor our fathers, as it is “...the first commandment with promise.” (Ephesians 6:2)

The commandment to obey one’s parents is beneficial for the child. First, obedience to our parents will permit things to go well. “that it may be well with thee.” (Deuteronomy 5:16). Children must learn to honor and respect their fathers in acts and in speech. Children are commanded to financially support their parents when needed. (1Timothy 5:4:2). Secondly, to obey one’s parents is beneficial for the child because “...thou mayest live long on the earth.” (Ephesians 6:3) Failure to honor and obey simply means a reduction of time on this earth. Therefore, we should reverence our fathers, for the sake of their work.

Most fathers’ intentions are good, but not perfect. God’s role as our Heavenly Father is always for our good and is perfect. So as earthly fathers, our thoughts, actions, and behaviors should imitate our Heavenly Father’s. Remember our goal is to be like our Heavenly Father, “For if ye love them which love you, what reward have ye?...And if ye salute your brethren only, what do ye more than others?...Be ye therefore perfect, even as your Father which is in heaven is perfect.” (Matthew 5:46-48)
